

CRC Unveils New Citizen Guide and "Get Involved" Webpage

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Today, the Constitution Revision Commission (CRC) unveiled a new <u>Citizen Guide</u> to help educate Floridians about the CRC process. The <u>Citizen Guide</u> is available on the CRC's recently launched <u>"Get Involved" webpage</u> which shares infographics, handouts and additional resources to encourage public participation in the CRC process.

CRC Chairman Carlos Beruff, said, "Our new <u>Citizen Guide</u> provides key information about the CRC process and is available on the CRC's <u>"Get Involved" webpage</u>. We want as much public participation as possible and encourage all interested Floridians to submit their proposals by October 6, which is the deadline being considered by the CRC for public proposals."

Once every 20 years, Florida's Constitution provides for the creation of a 37-member revision commission for the purpose of reviewing Florida's Constitution and proposing changes for voter consideration. The Constitution Revision Commission (CRC) meets for approximately one year, traveling the State of Florida, identifying issues, performing research and possibly recommending changes to the Constitution.
