Background on the CRC

- One of five ways Florida can amend state constitution
- Happens once every 20 years
- Tasked with carefully reviewing state constitution
- Puts items directly on ballot for voter consideration

CRC Members

- 37 members total
- 15 appointed by Governor (appoints chair)
- 9 appointed by House Speaker
- 9 appointed by Senate President
- 3 appointed by Chief Justice, Supreme Court
- Attorney General

Two Previous CRCs

1977-1978 Constitution Revision Commission

- Chaired by Sandy D'Alemberte
- Eight proposals on ballot
- None were passed by Florida voters

1997-1998 Constitution Revision Commission

- Chaired by Dexter Douglas
- Received nearly 200 proposals from public
- Nine revisions were placed on ballot
- Florida voters passed eight of them



- 18 partners involved
- Educate and inform public of the importance of the 2017-2018 CRC
- Encourage citizens to participate in the process
 - Monitor and suggest appointees
 - Attend public meetings and provide input on critical issues
- Encourage citizens to vote on proposals
